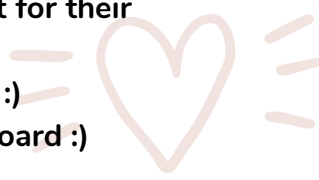

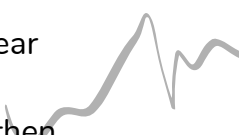
MOLI SCAVENGER HUNT

- A violin covered in plaster on the ceiling.


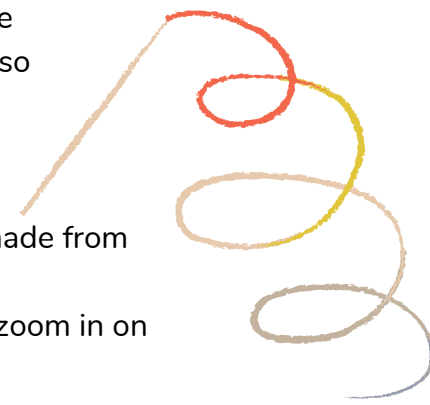
Level 1:

 - Stand under a sound shower, listen and watch the words come up on screen, and then rip off a quote you love and keep it!

Level 2:

- Find a death mask. Who is it of?
- Seek out a teenager's diary. What's their name? How do you document your life at the moment?

Level 3 & 4: Inspiration and Creativity Zone
